- DON'T JUST SEND OUT RESUMES ONLINE. LOOK FOR WAYS TO MAKE DIRECT CONTACT WITH EMPLOYERS.
- IDENTIFY YOUR SKILLS. RESEARCH FIELDS AND INDUSTRIES WHERE THESE SKILLS CAN BE USED. (I.E. USE FOCUS2 SELF ASSESSMENT FROM CAREER.UARK.EDU).
- LOCATE COMPANIES NEAR YOU BY USING A CHAMBER OF COMMERCE MEMBER DIRECTORY, AND LOOK FOR JOBS IN VARIOUS SECTORS OF THE ECONOMY. SOME HELPFUL WEBSITES ARE:
