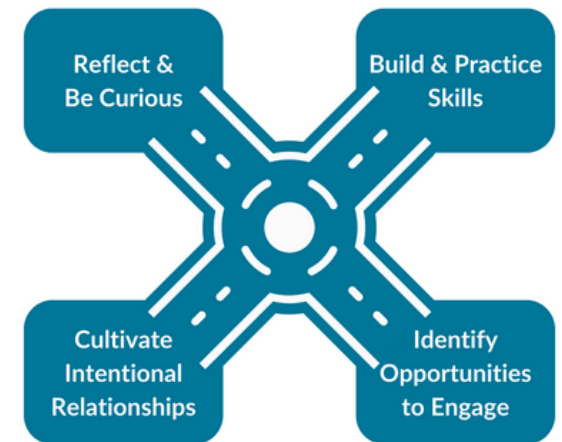
☐ What organizations are working on it?
